PCAF SETS DIRECTION FOR 2025, PRIORITIZES STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENT AND BUDGET EFFICIENCY

"Think, refocus, and align our goals and targets based on the Department of Agriculture (DA) Secretary's thrusts and priorities, anchored on 'Para sa Masaganang Bagong Pilipinas' 2024-2028 Plan".

This was the message of Philippine Council for Agriculture and Fisheries (PCAF) OIC Deputy Executive Director Cyril Soliaban as he encouraged the agency's officials and staff to focus and align their targets with DA's five-year plan, focusing on "strong partnership with farmers, fisherfolk, private sector, and other stakeholders" during the blended FY 2025 Direction Setting and General Assembly on January 13, 2025, in Quezon City.

The direction setting aims to identify priorities and allocate resources based on the agency's mandate and plan while outlining the steps needed and involving the entire workforce to ensure the attainment of the targets. continue reading on page 2

More than 140 PCAF employees joined the assembly to review their respective divisions' accomplishments in 2024 and set clear goals for 2025.

Among the priorities for the year include the creation of commodity boards as well as the conduct of regional AFC stakeholders' conferences and national summits, in partnership with the DA-Regional Field Offices and the DA Banner Programs.

In support of these objectives, Opulencia directed the strict adherence to the monthly disbursement program to address budget constraints and lapses.

It was also mentioned that procurement savings and unused balances will be allocated to fund other priority programs and projects.

To enhance technical and administrative support for the agency's Consultative Bodies, particularly in planning and financial matters, OIC Executive Director Julieta Opulencia directed the Human Resource Development Committee to strengthen its interventions for the agency's employees. This includes providing advance notice of scheduled training sessions and workshops, allowing employees to adjust their schedules and focus on the training.

These and the other agreements reached during the activity will serve as PCAF's guide throughout the year, aiming to contribute to a sustainable and developed Philippine agriculture. ■

In line with the Philippines' observance of Zero Waste Month, the Philippine Council for Agriculture and Fisheries (PCAF) and the Ecowaste Coalition officially signed a memorandum of agreement (MOA) on January 3, 2025, to kick off a collaborative project aimed at improving solid waste management practices. The signing ceremony, which took place in Quezon City, marks a significant step toward advancing the country's sustainability efforts through public-private sector partnerships.

PCAF Officer-in-Charge Deputy Executive Director Cyril Soliaban and Ecowaste Coalition National Coordinator Aileen Lucero formalized the partnership, witnessed by PCAF Partnership Development Division (PDD) Assistant Chief Conchita Del Rosario, PDD-Social Mobilization Section Chief and Capstone Project Lead Charmine Joy Esta, and Zero Waste Campaigner Jovito Benosa.

The capstone project, entitled "Improved Implementation of Proper Solid Waste Management Practices through LGU-AFC Collaboration: A Model of Stakeholder Communication and Engagement," will be implemented in three phases. It focuses on Poblacion West, Taysan, Batangas, with the first phase already conducted from September to November 2024. The pilot phase included the development of Social and Behavior Change Communication-based IEC campaigns and capacity-building training on waste management, composting, and recycling.

The project's second and third phases aim to ensure long-term sustainability, emphasizing behavior change, better compliance with waste segregation policies, and a marked increase in waste diversion success rates. "This collaboration aligns perfectly with PCAF's performance indicators and supports the Department of Agriculture's (DA's) three-year plan to expand available agri-fishery areas for increased production by improving land fertility and modernizing production systems through increased adoption of climate-resilient farming technologies," said Soliaban.

"Through strategic partnerships and effective communication, we can promote sustainable practices that contribute to environmental conservation and community well-being," he added.

Aside from the Ecowaste Coalition, PCAF also enlisted the support of the DA's Agriculture and Fisheries Information Division and the Department of Environment and Natural Resources-Environmental Management Bureau to develop a comprehensive communication plan and advocacy materials.

The project not only aims to build local capacity but also focuses on establishing a technical working committee to assist local government units (LGUs) in accurately recording waste data and improving waste diversion efforts. The initiative is supported by the Municipal LGU and the Municipal Agricultural and Fishery Council (MAFC) of Taysan, Batangas, that expressed their commitment to the project's successful implementation during a coordination meeting on September 25, 2024.

As the Philippines commemorates Zero Waste Month this January, this partnership highlights the importance of collective action and community engagement in achieving sustainable waste management practices.









funds to US agri representatives

Floreliz Avellana, Chief of the Planning, Knowledge Monitoring, and Management Division (PMKMD), discussed with United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) representatives, Agricultural Counselor Michael Ward and Agricultural Specialist Florencia Sevilla, the status of the US PL480* Program in the Philippines.

The session, held on January 17, 2025, in Quezon City, was led by PCAF OIC Executive Director Julieta Opulencia. PMKMD-Project Development Section (PDS) OIC Chief John Errasmus Mari Montiano presented to the USDA envoys the monetization and utilization of the US PL480 Program funds from 1991 to 2024.

The Philippine Council for Agriculture and Fisheries (PCAF) is the fund manager of the US PL480 Program. Through the PMKMD-PDS, the agency has been in charge of monitoring approved projects including the ongoing dairy project of the National Dairy Authority (NDA) and the Philippine Carabao Center.

Meanwhile, Ward expressed his appreciation to PCAF for monitoring the program. He assured the group that the Washington D.C. Office would be updated on the fund's status and future directions.

PCAF and USDA were also joined by representatives from the NDA.
